

## Level 3 in Work with Parents

### Unit 300 Enhanced - Build and maintain relationship in work with parents

#### Unit Aims

Unit 300 (6 credits) is a core unit for your Level 3 Award in Work with Parents. This enhanced course means you will also complete Unit 304 – Effective Communication with Parents (3 credits) at the same time. This will give you 9 credits overall towards your Award.

#### Learning Outcomes

This core unit helps family support practitioners:

- To work within a framework of practice that is in alignment with the National Occupational Standards for Work with Parents
- Understand and develop effective relationships with parents
- Agree and negotiate the basis of their relationship with parents
- Identify, understand and overcome barriers
- Understand how to agree boundaries for their work, including how to conclude pieces of work, and maintain relationship with parents
- Continue to develop their own professional practice
- Build confidence and practical competency, whilst building on existing knowledge and skills

#### Learning Hours
